



# Citing a Print Book Using EasyBib.com

1. Go to [www.easybib.com](http://www.easybib.com)

2. Select the BOOK tab




3. Search for your book by title or ISBN. ISBN is the preferred method since each title has its own unique ISBN. The ISBN can usually be found on the copyright page at the front of the book, or on the back cover of the book above the barcode. Use the 13-digit number. You do not need to include the dashes.



4. Once you have typed the 13-digit ISBN, click CITE IT



5. Find your book on the list of results and click CITE THIS



5. Look through all of the information that is prepopulated to make sure that it is all there. If any information such as the publisher, city, or year is missing, you will need to fill this in.

If you are citing an entire book written by one author, you are finished at this point and can click CREATE CITATION at the bottom. Copy and paste the MLA citation into your notes or Works Cited page.

**If you are citing a chapter in an anthology (a book where each chapter is written by a different author):**

6. Decide what chapter you want to use. Click the drop down menu at the top and change it from

“THE WHOLE BOOK” to “CHAPTER OR SECTION”

7. Once it redirects you, type the title of your chapter.

8. Under CONTRIBUTORS, it will likely list the editor as the “source author.” You will need to change this to “SOURCE EDITOR.”

9. Click “Add another contributor” so you can add the name of your chapter’s author. If your chapter has more than one author, click this button multiple times for each author.



10. Your chapter authors should be selected as “Section author.”

Type the names of each author of the chapter you are citing.




